Objectives & description	A Work Programme on Just Transition Pathways will be discussed for adoption by UNFCCC parties at COP28 in UAE this year. A key outcome of the work programme will be a framework for financing just transition pathways across the global climate finance architecture.			
	Under this backdrop, the panel will involve leaders from G7 countries, partners countries and social partners to discuss progress on just transition and the importance of green jobs and skills strategies for achieving the SDGs. It will address how their countries are investing in a low carbon economy to alleviate inequality and promote climate adaptation and mitigation. It will focus on examples and practices of partnerships between countries on issues of sectoral policies including clean energy, social protection, labour rights and reskilling to meet the needs of changing labour markets.			
	It will seek to reaffirm G7 countries' cooperation in the area of green jobs and skills promotion by discussing their policies and programmes in focus regions and countries of investment; and to mobilize multilateral cooperation.			
	G7 leaders and partners countries will be joined by workers and employers representatives to understand from a business and employee perspective the requirements to meet climate goals while ensuring a just transition.			
	The session builds on an ILO initiative Support to improve the effectiveness of development assistance in 'green jobs and skills' (ilo.org) financed by BMZ via GIZ, which involves cooperation with G7 partners to intensify investment in green jobs and skills in cooperation with developing countries.








# How large is the Pavilion? How many people can it hold?
