



Joint IOE-ITUC letter to Resident Coordinators

Dear Excellency,

The **International Organisation of Employers (IOE)**, representing more than 50 million companies, and the **International Trade Union Confederation (ITUC)**, representing more than 200 million workers, have been deeply engaged in the debate on the UN reform.

We have welcomed the initiative of the UN Secretary General to reform the United Nations Development System (UNDS) with a view to improving its accountability, efficiency and coherence. The reform presents important opportunities for strengthening the system's coherency and addressing long-standing concerns about fragmentation and duplication of efforts among the system's funds, programmes and specialised agencies. The "One-UN" approach is an important step towards implementing the Agenda 2030 and reaching the SDGs.
