Why?

Everywhere in the world, businesses face talent shortages. By 2030, the shortage of around 85 million people could cost trillions of dollars in lost economic opportunity. Nearly 7 in 10 (69%) of companies surveyed by ManpowerGroup report skills shortages and difficulty hiring¹.

Global skills mobility can be part of the solution, provided that the legal frameworks for migration are adapted to today's economic, political and social realities. Labor mobility is a key component of growth and competitiveness both for companies and economies. Demographic realities, political considerations and business imperatives are driving the need for greater mobility of workers at all skill levels.

With this background, technology (including Artificial Intelligence, Block Chain, etc) can contribute to solving this gap. Start-ups around the world are working on concrete solutions that can have an impact on the long term on improving migration governance, including through certification recognition.

What?

Oracle and the International Organisation of Employers (IOE) co-host a business flagship event in the margins of the first United Nations [International Migration Review Forum](#) (IMRF). The IMRF will assess the progress of governments in the implementation of the [Global Compact for migration](#) (GCM), which calls for stronger use of technology.

The event lines up a series of speakers who link the business priorities of skills mobility, responsible cross-border recruitment, and skills recognition to three of the 23 objectives of the GCM. Three start-ups, the winner from the IOE-Oracle Hackathon and two other technology-based start-ups will provide a teaser of their solutions. Their full pitching will take place on 17 May at 1:15pm ET at the UNHQ.

Objective: fostering a public-private dialogue on business priorities related to migration and triggering impact on policymaking.
